

GETTING TO KNOW THE NEW PRINCIPAL (extracts taken from the ICHS Monthly E-letter)



What schools were you at before Immaculate? I started out as a librarian at St. George's College then I taught for 21 years there. I then spent 4 years and 8 months as principal at Mount Alvernia High School.

What are some recognitions or achievements you have received? At the end of my tenure at Mount Alvernia High, for little girls to look at me and say they wanted to be like me when they grew up, meant a lot. The way they described me and the way they saw me in the short space of time that I was there was very special to me. I remember one student in grade 9 who wrote me something that I later framed, which said that I taught her what it was like to be a lady. Not to be soft, but to be strong because typically they are told that ladies must be soft and behave a certain way, but I took it out of that box. That made it very hard for me to walk away from

them, for them to tell me the words 'Miss I love you' is the biggest recognition of my life so far. Another recognition was within the four and a half years at Mt. Alvernia, when the principals of the high schools in St. James had a surprise party for me. For my colleagues in the profession to do something like this for me and to look at me and say 'You made us better' or 'You made our jobs as principals better, was really touching.

Which schools did you attend? Merl Grove High School and St. Aloysius Primary School.

What is your most memorable pastime? At this point in my life, my hobby is shopping. I love shopping and taking a book, sitting in front of my television, having a shower and just sitting down until I fall asleep.

Mrs. Reynolds understands the value of discipline. She prefers to be respected than to be liked and has the best interest of her ladies at heart. Though she is strict, that strictness originates from a place of love



Kathy McDonald (Parris) appointed Trustee of the Peel District School Board, Brampton, wards 3 and 4. Kathy works tirelessly to help each child realize their full potential and works with the community to support student success for all students and dismantle systemic discrimination. She is a coordinator of a community youth steel band, a children's storyteller of Jamaican folktales, a member of the Congress of Black Women Brampton Chapter and a member of the United Achievers' Club and was previously chair of the Caribbean pavilion for Carabram, Brampton's multicultural festival. Kathy received an award of Excellence as one of the 100 Most Influential Black Canadians.

Dr. Mary Anne Chambers, a former Ontario cabinet minister, author, longtime champion of the University of Guelph and lifelong education and community advocate, has been named as the University's next chancellor. Mary Anne is the 10th Chancellor appointed to this role. Among her honours, she was named to the Order of Ontario and has received the Queen Elizabeth II Golden Jubilee and Diamond Jubilee medals, the Prime Minister of Jamaica's Medal of Appreciation, a University of the West Indies Vice-Chancellor's Award and a YWCA Toronto Woman of Distinction Award. She is currently a governor of Canada's International Development Research Centre, a senior fellow at York University's Glendon School of Public and Interna-



tional Affairs and is the special advisor for the City of Markham's anti-Black racism strategy. On Oct 29/22, Mary Anne received an award of Excellence as one of the 100 Most Influential Black Canadians. Recently, she released her first book called "From the Heart"



Audrea J. Golding, recently attended the Women, Influence and Power in Law Awards dinner in Washington, DC, where she along with her partner Carmita Alonso were named 2022 WIPL Awards honorees and were recognized by Corporate Counsel for their commitment to advancing the empowerment of woman in law.

Dr. Yolande E. Chan, joined McGill University's Desautels Faculty of Management as Dean and James McGill Professor in August 2021. Prior to joining Desautels, Yolande served as Associate Dean of Research, PhD and MSc Programs, and the E. Marie Shantz Chair of Digital Technology at Smith School of Business at Queen's University. A gifted educator, she received the Commerce Teaching Excellence Award and the Commerce Professor Student Life Award given to the professor who has contributed most to the student life of the graduating class. Dean Chan has also received the Queen's University Distinguished Service Award, the Queen's University Award for Excellence in Graduate Supervision, and a Smith School Researcher Achievement Award. She has previously served as Queen's University's Associate Vice-Principal



(Research). Before joining academia, she worked with Andersen Consulting (now Accenture). Dean Chan is a Fellow and Distinguished Cum Laude member of the Association for Information Systems. She is entered in the Canadian Who's Who, the Who's Who of Canadian Women, and the Who's Who in Canadian Business Directories.



Donette Chin-Loy Chang, recently received honorary degrees from Toronto Metropolitan University and the University of the West Indies. She is a member of the Black North Initiative board, the Caribbean Canada Institute board and serves on the Onyx Initiative Advisory board and the National Coalition of Canadians Against Asian Racism Committee. Donette has recently joined the TIFF Board of Directors.

Dawn Marie James, Class of 1967, was the recipient of the National Chorale of Jamaica (NCOJ) Medal of Excellence and who has also distinguished herself in the field of classical music at the international level. 


